CATHERINE KARAM NODURFT

Catherine Karam Nodurft has been singing in choirs, musicals, and as a soloist since she was a young girl. She studied vocal performance in college under the direction of world-renowned opera singer, Linda Zoghby, and is currently a cantor at St. Monica Catholic Church in Dallas. Catherine is the Senior Director of Community Engagement at the ALS Association of Texas, and works to help people with ALS and their families. She and her husband are blessed to have a rambunctious toddler (and another on the way!). Catherine is honored to be here this afternoon to join the Richardson Community Band in performing some of her favorite classics.

PROGRAM NOTES

The Love of Three Oranges by Sergei Prokofiev (1891-1953) clearly be-wildered American audiences when it was first performed in 1921. A young prince is cursed by a wicked witch and must go on a quest for three oranges that are guarded by a female giant. When he finds them, each of the oranges turns out to contain a princess. After a few misfortunes—one princess is turned briefly into a rat—the opera ends happily. The MARCHE is the best-known work from the opera and was used by CBS in the radio-drama series The FBI in Peace and War that was broadcast from 1944 to 1958.

Leonard Bernstein was one of those rare musical geniuses who excelled at every musical discipline – performer, composer, conductor and teacher. In his 1957 Broadway production, *West Side Story*, a reworking of Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet*, Bernstein successfully integrated swing, bop, cool jazz, Latin music, and ballad, into an opera score unlike any other. One of the most unforgettable melodies from the production is the poignant **SOMEWHERE**.

Based on folk tunes, *The Irish Suite* was composed in 1947 by Leroy Anderson (1908-1975) as a four-movement collection entitled *Eire Suite* and was first performed by the Boston Pops Orchestra under the direction of Arthur Fiedler.

THE GIRL I LEFT BEHIND ME, the final movement of *The Irish Suite* is a military march - a fife tune - used by British, American and Irish soldiers.

EMBRACEABLE YOU by brothers George and Ira Gershwin was written in 1928 for an unpublished operetta named *East Is West*. It was eventually published in 1930 and included in the Broadway musical *Girl Crazy*, where it was performed by Ginger Rogers in a song and dance routine choreographed by Fred Astaire. Billie Holiday's 1944 recording was inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame in 2005.

Darius Milhaud (1892-1974) wrote the **SUITE FRANCAISE** for wind band in 1944. It was premiered by the Goldman Band in 1945 and included the following notes about the piece: The five parts of this suite are named after French provinces, the very ones in which the American and Allied armies fought together with the French underground for the liberation of my country – Normandy, Brittany, Ile-de-France (of which Paris is the center), Alsace-Lorraine, and Provence. I used some folk tunes of the provinces. I wanted the young Americans to hear the popular melodies of those parts of France where their fathers and brothers fought ... (for) the peaceful and democratic people of France.

Written by *The Four Seasons* songwriting team of Bob Crewe and Bob Gaudio **CAN'T TAKE MY EYES OFF YOU** (1967) was Frankie Valli's biggest solo hit until his #1 *My Eyes Adored You* in 1975. Earning a gold record, the Valli

version was used by NASA in 2008 as a wake-up song on the STS-126 Space Shuttle mission to celebrate the anniversary of astronaut Christopher Ferguson, crew captain.

Ira Gershwin (1896-1983) was responsible for crafting the lyrics for some of the most memorable songs of the twentieth century, including **SOMEONE TO WATCH OVER ME, EMBRACEABLE YOU** and dozens more. '**S WONDERFUL** was introduced in the Broadway musical *Funny Face*(1927). Immensely popular from the onset because of its whimsical wordplay, it topped the pop charts twice in 1928.

Niccolò Piccinni (1728-1800), an Italian composer of symphonies, sacred music and chamber works, was best known for his operas. His most famous stage work was La buona figliuola (THE GOOD DAUGHTER), which established him as one of the leading composers of his day. In the plot, the father of the orphaned Checchina, whose character is in question upon her engagement to a man of position, returns to Italy and reveals the truth of her birth. He verifies that she is as entitled to a favorable marriage as any Venetian woman. The work premiered in Rome in 1760 and was considered the foremost "opera buffa" of its time.

SOMEONE TO WATCH OVER ME is one of the Gershwin's' most iconic songs, written by Ira for his wife Leonore in commemoration of their marriage on September 14, 1926. The song made its Broadway debut in the smash hit musical *Oh Kay!* (1926). It was originally an up-tempo swing tune, but after experimenting one day, George Gershwin (1898-1937) tried the melody as a ballad and fashioned one of the great love songs in American musical theater history.

From the album Canadian Brass Plays Lennon And McCartney comes this one-of-a-kind medley for concert band. Featuring the unique artistry of the world's foremost brass quintet and the legendary songs of The Beatles, ALL YOU NEED IS LOVE is a collage of memories that include When I'm Sixty-Four; Michelle; Sgt. Pepper's Lonely-Hearts Club Band/With A Little Help from My Friends; Eleanor Rigby and I Want to Hold Your Hand.

Upon leaving the Marine Band, John Philip Sousa (1854-1932) found success composing operettas, including the popular *El Capitan*. After the success of this operetta, Sousa regrettably declined an offer of \$100,000 for **THE BRIDE-ELECT MARCH** (1897), from which this final march was extracted. Pieced together from various sections of the operetta, the march's principal theme was developed from the song, *Unchain the Dogs of War*, which ended Act II.

Robin Owens has been the Conductor of the Richardson Community Band since May 2017. Prior to her affiliation with RCB, she served a variety of North Texas school districts, including Assistant Director of Bands at Richardson Junior High in Richardson, TX; Plano East Senior High in Plano, TX; Sherman High School in Sherman, TX; Director of Bands at Apollo Junior High in Richardson, TX; and most recently Wilson Middle School in Plano, TX.

Robin received her Bachelor of Music Education from Baylor University and a Master of Music from Texas A&M Commerce. Aside from teaching and conducting, Robin also performs professionally with Dallas Winds, playing contralto and contrabass clarinets.



Jane Chambers joined the Richardson Community Band as a member of the flute section in the Fall of 1977. She has served as Associate Conductor of the Band since 1991. In addition to her conducting duties, Jane also writes the announcer's scripts and Program Notes for our concerts. She is a career music educator and is Director of Music at the Ursuline Academy of Dallas. Professional recognitions include 1997 Teacher of the Year and Who's Who of American Teachers. Jane holds a Bachelor and Master of Music Education from the University of North Texas and is Past President of the Texas Private School Music Educators Association (TPSMEA).
